

I. Introduction

The Association of Phonosurgeons of India (APSI), as the senior society representing the subspecialty of laryngology, has developed guidelines for developing and implementing postgraduate training in laryngology. The main focus of these guidelines is to provide a resource for new surgeons and residents considering further training in Laryngology

II. Definition of Subspecialty

Laryngology is a subspecialty within Otolaryngology – Head and Neck Surgery encompassing a field of knowledge that deals with disorders of voice, airway and swallowing. The laryngologist has special expertise in the diagnostic and therapeutic approaches to problems in these areas and participates in the advancement of knowledge through clinical and/or basic science research. Laryngology is a recognized area within otolaryngology training programs and further postgraduate fellowship training is an option for those otolaryngologists wishing to further their education in the field.

III. General Scope of Fellowship Education

Specialized postgraduate training in laryngology should allow exposure to the full range of laryngology, recognizing that each program will have different emphases and focus on certain areas more than others. Areas of emphases should include:

- 1. Neurolaryngology
- 2. Professional voice care
- 3. Neoplastic and non-neoplastic diseases of the larynx
- 4. Swallowing disorders
- 5. Disorders of the upper airway

V. Clinical Fellowship Training

The program course of study should be comprehensive and should provide each fellow with opportunities for progressive management of patients in both the clinical and surgical environments.

The academic component will provide supplemental education in the basic sciences related to laryngology including speech and rehabilitative sciences, genetics, (neuro)anatomy, (neuro)physiology, (histo)pathology, pharmacology and wound healing. The latter should include laser-tissue interactions with the various lasers used in laryngology. Fellows are expected to participate in periodic laryngology rounds that discuss comprehensive clinical issues, research issues and morbidity and mortality. The curriculum is designed so that upon completion, the fellow will have sufficient background and experience to establish an independent laryngology program at an academic institution.

Techniques in the diagnosis and management of patients with voice, airway and swallowing disorders should be taught to the laryngology fellow either through direct mentorship by the fellowship faculty or through other resources such as didactic learning or attendance at formal courses. Hands-on experience is expected.

Examination

There will be a sessional examination at the end of the first semester and a final examination at the end of the course. The final examination will have both theory and practical examinations, conducted by two internal and two external examiners. Certificate of Fellowship will be issued only after passing the examination.

1)M.B.B.S. Degree recognized by the Medical Council of India.
2)Should have passed the PG Degree MS in ENT from any of the Medical Colleges in India, recognized by the Medical Council of India or DNB in ENT approved by the National Board of Examinations, New Delhi.
(Candidates who have appeared or are appearing for the MD/DNB examination may apply but the provisional or permanent PG Degree certificate should be produced at the time of admission counseling if selected, failing which admission will not be granted).

- i. Valid photo ID proof
- ii. Proof of age. (Passport/Secondary School Leaving certificate showing date of birth/Tahsildar's certificate).
- iii. Proof of Nationality (Passport/Voters ID/PAN Card). iv. Self-attested copy of following documents:
 - a) MBBS Degree Certificate.
 - b) MD/ DNB Degree Certificate.
 - c) Permanent Medical Council Registration Certificate of MBBS/PG Degree.
- v. Certificate from Principal of respective Medical College/Institution for candidates who are appeared/ appearing for MD/DNB (in case of candidates who have not yet passed the course)

Selection process

Entrance Examination (MCQ) 60 MCQs in LARYNGOLOGY One hour duration

4 marks for correct answer and -1 for wrong answer

In case of tie, eldest among them will be selected.

Candidates coming 2nd and 3rd in the entrance examination will be given 5 and 3 grace marks respectively, which they can carry to the next year's entrance examination, so that they will have a marginal advantage over the others next time. Candidates who came 2nd and 3rd in the last year's entrance examination will have 5 and 3 marks respectively added to marks they obtain in this years examination.

- a) Candidates will have to make their own arrangements to appear for the entrance test and interview and no TA/DA will be provided. No personal intimation will be sent regarding entrance test.
- b) The Director, Dr Jayakumars Institute of Laryngology will prepare and publish the Select List and Waitlist of Candidates.
- c) Admission Memo will be issued to the selected candidates. The candidate has to report on the date fixed by the Director.
- d) Candidates who do not turn up for the allotment as per schedule, at the place and time notified, will forfeit their chance for admission, and will not be considered for admission in future or arising vacancies, irrespective of the rank.
- e) Candidates who discontinue the course after 10.00 am on 15th March 2020 will be liable to pay liquidated damages.
- f) Documents to be produced at the time of Admission (original & one photocopy)
 - a) MBBS Degree Certificate.
 - b) MD/ DNB Degree Certificate.
 - c) MD/ DNB Attempt Certificate.
 - d) Permanent Medical Council Registration Certificate of MBBS/PG Degree.
 - e) Character/conduct certificate issued by competent authority (head of institute/gazetted officer).
 - f) Selected candidates should submit Registration Certificates from the Travancore-Cochin

Council of Modern Medicine within one month of admission failing which their admission will be cancelled.

Course Completion

Successful completion of the fellowship program mandates the following --

- Pass in the Exit Examination
- Logbook
- Onepaper/posterpresentationinState/National/Internationalconference.
- One Publication in International Journal of Phonosurgery and Laryngology

Leave during the course:

All the 365 days of the year are working days for fellows. However, they will be permitted to avail casual leave for 12 days, but not more than 4 days at a stretch. Any other leave will entail extension of the course. Those who take leave without prior sanction are liable to be considered to be on unauthorized absence. If the fellow is absent with out authorization for more than 10 days, he/she will be terminated from the course and liquidated damages will be realized. All fellows are eligible for weekly off for one day. This will be allowed by the Head of the Department concerned without affecting the routine functioning of the Department. Weekly off cannot be accumulated. CMEs, workshops and other academic programs conducted by recognized academic bodies are essential aspects of training program. All fellows will be permitted to attend such program without affecting the routine working of the Department concerned. The Head of the Department shall sanction leave-on-duty to fellows provided they apply prior to the CME program and submit attendance certificate on return. Any violation will be viewed seriously warranting termination of the course.

Private Practice

Post Graduate students shall not engage in private practice of any sort during the course of study.

General

All students admitted to Dr Jayakumars Institute of Laryngology will be bound by the rules and regulations as decided by the Director, Dr Jayakumars centre for Advanced Research in laryngology Pvt Ltd from time to time. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Prospectus, the Director may at anytime revise or amend any clause in the prospectus. Any courtcases/disputes shall be within the exclusive jurisdiction of competent courts in Kerala.
